

PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT AND OPERATE A SOLID WASTE VOLUME REDUCTION PLANT

Pursuant to Section(s) 22a-208a and 22a-454 of the Connecticut General Statutes ("CGS") and Section 22a-209-4 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies ("RCSA"), a Permit to Construct and Operate is hereby issued to:

To operate the volume reduction plant ("Facility") located at 250 Main Street, East Windsor, Connecticut. Subsequently, the Permit to Operate No. 04701030-PO issued on December 9, 2011 is no longer in effect and is superseded by the conditions of this Permit as specified in the conditions and attachments set forth herein.

All terms in this Permit are defined in the Permit or if not defined in the Permit are defined in Sections 22a-209-4, and 22a-449(c)-100 of the RCSA or in Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations ("CFR") Part 273.


This Permit is based on the information described in the CGS Section 22a-208a permit application (Application No. 201104821) submitted to the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection by the applicant on June 6, 2011, amended on June 10, 2013. The Permittee must keep records of all data used to complete the permit application and any supplemental information submitted for the effective term of the Permit. The permit application is hereby incorporated by reference as part of the Permit. Any false statement or inaccuracies contained in the information submitted by the Permittee may result in the suspension, revocation or modification of this Permit and civil or criminal enforcement action.

The Permittee shall comply with all terms and conditions of this Permit. Any violation of any provision of this Permit may subject the Permittee to enforcement action pursuant to the CGS including but not limited to Sections 22a-6 and 22a-131.

This Permit may be revoked, suspended, modified, transferred or reissued, in accordance with applicable law. The Commissioner may also modify this Permit when it is deemed necessary to do so. The Permittee shall submit a permit application to the Commissioner at least one hundred twenty (120) calendar days before making any changes to any of the permitted areas or activities. Any application shall be approved in writing by the Commissioner prior to the Permittee implementing such changes.

Nothing herein authorizes any person, municipality or authority to hinder municipal or regional solid waste recycling efforts. All activities conducted by the Permittee at the Facility shall be in accordance with this Permit and in compliance with the statewide Solid Waste Management Plan

This Permit shall become effective on June 24 , 2014 and shall expire five (5) years from this effective date.
